



Conservation of Architectural Heritage – Selected Issues

The course is intended for architects and graduates of different engineering faculties as well as humane studies who are interested in historic buildings and towns and in the remarkable changes that have taken place in the cultural landscape. The purpose of the course is to provide the participants with an opportunity to gain or enhance (architects) knowledge of selected contemporary problems of architectural conservation and to explore area of interest related to this branch of knowledge. Benefiting from its location in the historic town of Gdańsk, the programme combines the study of conservation theory and philosophy with an exploration of the technical aspects of architectural conservation.

The core of the course covers the history, ethics and philosophy of historic environment conservation and the integration of these with a critical understanding of contemporary issues in building conservation practice.

Specific topics covered in subsequent lectures (45 min. each) will include:
